Be Safe on the Internet.

With so many stories in the popular press warning about scams and fraudsters it's worrying how to be safe when surfing the net and most importantly when dealing with finances on-line.

We are advised that passwords should always be secure and not something easy to guess like your name, dog's name, house name or something that is known about you like your favourite football team.

One government scheme suggests creating secure passwords from 3 random words i.e. something like *bus*, *tree* and *camel* and combining them into a single word.

I would also advise you use at least one Capital letter and not put it in the first position of your password, add at least one numeral and one other non alpha numeric character to these words.

So a password could be:- **busTreecamel007?**

The tricky bit is remembering it. A way to do it is creating a simple story, about your chosen password.

So in this instance, imagine a *bus* crashing into *tree* and a *camel* drops out of it, which thinks it is James Bond (007), I think (?).

Having used busTreecamel007? as an example of a secure password can I suggest you don't use this as a real password but think of one yourself.

There are 2 websites which you may find helpful in giving further advice on passwords and many other aspects of computer and internet security.

Be CyberStreet Wise (<https://www.cyberstreetwise.com>) is a government website.

Be Safe Online (<https://www.getsafeonline.org>) is a private site but backed by most of the big banks, City of London Police, government agencies and others.

Treasurer's Report and Accounts for y/e 31/3/2016

The Newsletter contains a copy of the accounts for the y/e 31/3/2016 for review and approval at our AGM on 12th May. The accounts have been independently examined and a certificate confirming this will be available for your review at the AGM.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with Charity commission requirements and advice. The entries are in the main self-explanatory but I have supplied further information below on the main larger expense items.

You will recall we had a recruiting drive for new members in Autumn 2015 and smaller events after that. In order to promote our U3a we spent £135 on leaflets. In addition, we spent a further £156 on a vibrant banner/sashes and eye catching T shirts.

As your committee we regularly review our subscription level and took the view this time last year to reduce our subscriptions by £7 to £18 (magazine included) and £16 without magazine. We expect subscriptions for 2017/18 to remain at current levels. We are looking to provide good speakers at meetings and our costs for this are likely to be around £60 per meeting.
